FLNRO, DFO, Mill, Cowichan Tribes, CWB will develop parameters for decisionmaking on spring flow levels. Will agree by Feb. what's to be done. Project manager hiring taking longer than expected. All data on natural boundary work flown, engineering work proposal almost ready to be posted. Salmon returns: good chinook 11,742 adults. Jacks 1343-much lower than normal. Chums-51,000much less than one third of target. Bad chum vear. Drinking Water Ref-CTAG/CVRD 10-vear vision work plan-concerns about time line. Koksilah -FLNRO/tribes given resources as water crisis continues.
- 2.Initial public input for Cowichan Provincial River Plan. Don Herr states regarding knotweed and other invasive plants are increasing by 10% a year. Active knotweed assessment in the watershed ongoing this fall to monitor and eradicate.
